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The Great Schools Partnership and the Knox County Schools Curriculum and Instruction Department will begin accepting applications for the 2019-2020 TeacherPreneur grant award program on Monday, May 6th, 2019.

The TeacherPreneur program, which is in its sixth year, allows Knox County teachers to be creative problem solvers by developing new or different instructional ideas to improve student learning. The most promising ideas in alignment with KCS/GSP priorities are funded in a pilot setting through these innovation grants.

Knox County teachers are invited to attend a workshop, where the application process will be outlined and past winners will be on hand to discuss the instructional impact the grant had on them and their students. Workshops will take place at Sarah Simpson in the library from 10:00-11:00am on Thursday, June 6th and 4:30 – 5:30pm on Tuesday, August 13th. The event is listed on My Learning Plan, and teachers are encouraged to sign up ahead of time. Light refreshments will be served.

The TeacherPreneur program is a joint project of Great Schools Partnership and Knox County Schools Curriculum and Instruction Department. Great Schools Vice President of Research, Development, and Evaluation, Jonathan Scoonover said, “Many of today’s challenges, big or small, are most effectively solved at the local level. Through TeacherPreneur, Great Schools Partnership is excited to provide classroom teachers with resources and encouragement to be innovators and problem solvers at the most local level of public education – the classroom.”

Selected applications will move to the next round of the grant process and will be asked to attend an interview in September.. Winners will be announced in late September.
